

Multiple Drugs with Their Functions (OT Use)

Drug Name	Function / Use
Lignocaine	Local anesthesia for minor procedures
Bupivacaine	Long-acting spinal and epidural anesthesia
Ketamine	General anesthetic and pain relief
Propofol	Induction and maintenance of anesthesia
Paracetamol	Pain and fever control
Diclofenac	Pain relief and anti-inflammatory
Morphine	Severe pain management
Tramadol	Moderate to severe pain relief
Ceftriaxone	Broad-spectrum antibiotic
Amoxicillin	Treatment of bacterial infections
Gentamicin	Serious bacterial infections
Metronidazole	Anaerobic bacterial infections
Adrenaline	Cardiac arrest and anaphylaxis
Atropine	Treatment of bradycardia
Dopamine	Shock and low blood pressure
Noradrenaline	Severe hypotension
Suxamethonium	Muscle relaxation for intubation
Vecuronium	Muscle relaxation during surgery
Atracurium	Skeletal muscle relaxation
Diazepam	Sedative and anti-anxiety
Midazolam	Preoperative sedation
Ondansetron	Prevention of nausea and vomiting
Metoclopramide	Control of vomiting
Hydrocortisone	Allergic reactions and inflammation
Chlorpheniramine	Antihistamine for allergy
Normal Saline	Fluid replacement
Ringer Lactate	Dehydration and shock
Povidone Iodine	Skin antiseptic before surgery
Chlorhexidine	Antiseptic for skin and wounds
